What are the reasons for joining Economic and Monetary Union and why are some countries against it? Brexit is a symbol of the European crisis, should Member States consider a broader revision of the EU treaties? How and why should the EU ensure energy security in the shortest possible time? Which country should have the highest percentage of funding distribution in the Multiannual Financial Framework 2021-2027 and will the EU Next Generation Recovery Plan reflect the needs of individual Member States in mitigating the impact of a pandemic COVID-19?

Finding the right answers to these and many other questions is very difficult and in addition to the leaders of EU member states, students of the Faculty of International Relations of the University of Economics in Bratislava also try to find them by negotiations, where they represent the views of individual countries. Outputs from the round tables, which took place with several important personalities from the areas of focus of this year's model conference, will be presented on April 13, 2021 at the 14th year of the Model Conference.

The model conference is the culmination of the subject Negotiation in Diplomatic Practice, which is taught at the Faculty of International Relations on the basis of the need for practical training of students in the field of diplomatic negotiations. We can simply say that it is a simulation of an international conference addressing the issue of current international relations. In this way, the Faculty of International Relations strives to prepare its students as best they can for their future work. Students are divided into 3 teams - the Organizing Team, the Political Section and the Economic Section.

This project is unique not only because of the fact, that the whole Model conference is organized by students, but this year's topic of which is Europe 2030 concerns all age categories, is intended for the professional and lay public, and therefore the students of the 5th year of Faculty of International relations decided to involve seniors of the University of the Third Age of the University of Economics and also students of the Private Slovak Grammar School - students of the Diplomacy study field. The organizers of the Model Conference strive to provide their experience of negotiations in diplomatic practice to the general public and thus use the views, attitudes and knowledge of different generations in addressing current issues of the European Union.

In this year's Model Conference, The Economic Section decided to choose the creation of the Multiannual Financial Framework for years 2021-2027 as the main focus of their discussions. Their work also includes EU's Next Generation Recovery Plan, which aims to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on EU member states. Students chose one of the EU member states, which they are going to represent during the both academic semesters. Within these negotiations it was important for the students to become acquainted with the approaches of the represented member states, which were presented in the previous budget periods. They studied the main areas where funds have

flowed in recent years. The core of the MFF was the knowledge of the previous document, its individual heads, programs and the financial volume that had been used. For a more authentic process in creating the MFF, students decided to use the so-called "model situations", where they created a scenario according to which voting and further discussions took place. At the end of the first semester, students entered more profound phase of creation, where they had the task of creating new names of individual heads in the MFF and the way in which expenditures will be redistributed over time, whether they will rise or fall.



The European Union is a unique model of cooperation, developed by learning from history and accepting the uniqueness of each participating country, in full accordance with its main motto "United in diversity".

Europe must show that it is able to have a constructive dialogue on cooperation and to overcome the differences; to be united and principled in its approaches. In the geopolitical field, we are only stronger if we can act together. That is the reason why we consider the unity of the European community to be a key element in overcoming any of the obstacles emerging from current problems.

The Vision of the European Union is a theme for the political section during 14th Model Conference of the University of Economics. Within the political section, we presented the key areas that the representatives of selected member states of

European Union address. These are the topics: Carbon Neutrality, Circular Economy, Security and enlargement of European Union. The selected topics reflect the current state and challenges the European Union is facing. Based on a deeper analysis of the attitudes of individual countries, students are able to convey a comprehensive position, which is directly confronted with the attitudes of other countries, thanks to which we can simulate real negotiations of the participating countries.

Ing. Ivan Štefanec, MBA, PhD. is a Member of the European Parliament and member of the Committee on International Market and the Consumer Protection. Prior to joining The European Parliament, he was a member of the National Council of the Slovak Republic and vice-chair of the Committee for European Affairs. (2006-2014). In 2004 he was appointed government plenipotentiary for the introduction of the euro in Slovakia.

Eugen Jurzyc has been a Member of the European Parliament since July 2019, elected for the SaS party, for which he was a member of the National Council of the Slovak Republic and a team officer for public finances since the summer of 2014.
